Memorial Day is a federal holiday in the United State for honoring the U.S. military personnel who died while serving. Decoration of military graves with American Flags, hence the original name was Decoration Day.

Many traditions are family gatherings, picnics, visiting loved one's grave sites, or attending a ceremony by the community marking the historic day. The President of the United States may give a speech or lay a wreath at Arlington National Cemetery and 5,000 participants decorate the graves of the 20,000 Civil War soldiers buried there.

Flag Day, June 14th celebrates the official symbol for the United States. Our "Stars and Stripes" Flag Day was first recognized by Congress on June 14, 1777.

Did you know that the United States Army also celebrates their birthday on June 14? Did you know the current American flag was designed by a high school student who anticipated Hawaii and Alaska joining the union? Did you know that Flag Day was observed nationally for the first time on the 100th anniversary of the Stars and Stripes?
