Taking knowledge of flag education to the classrooms of our area students is an important way to help shape young citizents into patriotic, responsible adults. Recognize the classrooms, students or even businesses that display flags or show patriotism. You will find several examples of awards or citations to hand out. Add your own flare to them by engaving a plaque and honor their classroom or business with a presentation. If you see a flag that needs replaced maybe your auxiliary can purchase and present to that business or organization that flys it proudly.

Military Flags of Order of Precedence, this can be confusing for many so according to The Department of Defense guidelines, military flags should be displayed (from left to right) Army, Marines, Navy, Air Force, Space Force and Coast Guard.

Showing your patriotism is not only for days like Independence Day, I encourage you to wear patriotic items as often as you can. Brothers and Sisters, wear your red, white and blue and educate everyone why you are passionate about our Veterans and Americanism. Be proud of your patriotism.

Patriotic Instructors should research and take the time to learn and understand the traditions and ceremonies of the Auxiliary, found in by-law book or on national website (MALTA resources). Your job is to help educate the public about proper flag etiquette and the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

When our military men and women leave the service for civilian life, some may feel displaced, depressed, or lost. They may be suffering from PTSD (Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder). They may feel the stress from being out of uniform, without their comrades, and lacking a mission with those around them. 

For over a hundred years the "Buddy"® Poppy has been an integral part of the VFW community. The Poppy is the official memorial flower of the VFW representing the blood shed by American service members. It reminds us that we will not forget their sacrifices.

This year marks 100 years since the VFW registered the name "Buddy" Poppy with the U.S. Patent Office. On May 20, 1924 a certificate was issued granting the VFW all trademark rights in the name Buddy under the classification of artificial flowers.

How to Order

- Contact your VFW Post to order Poppies. If you have any problems ordering, please contact me.
- Request the order form from your Department Headquarters. Be sure to allow plenty of time (8-12 weeks) for delivery before your distribution date.
- Brochures, "Buddy"® Poppy distribution supplies and promotional items can be purchased from the VFW store at vfwstore.org or by calling 1-833-VFW-Vets.

New "Buddy"® Poppy

"Buddy"® Poppy Distribution Tips

- 1. Contact your city/town clerk's office to see if a permit is required for your distribution event.
- 2. Get permission from your desired distribution location(s). Ask store manager/owners permission before promoting your distribution event.
- 3. Make sure Auxiliary members know when and where the distribution event will take place.
- 4. Contact your local radio station or paper to share information about your distribution event and/or share on social media.
- 5. Ask local youth groups for their assistance.
- 6. Have Poppy distributers wear Auxiliary (or VFW) braded clothing to promote the Auxiliary and VFW while also helping the public to connect the distribution event to the organization.
- 7. Use the "Buddy"® Poppy Chairmans Manuel to educate distributers. Remind them that they are distributing the Poppies for donations **NOT** selling them.

NEVER refuse someone a "Buddy"® Poppy because they are unable to donate.

EXTENSION

We need to make certain that current Auxiliaries are sound, but it is equally important to make presentations to bachelor Posts and when viable to institute new Auxiliaries. An Auxiliary cannot exist without a Post and there must be a 2/3 vote of the Post to get started. Positive and knowledgeable Auxiliary presenters are important when addressing a Post.

Ask permission to describe the benefits of an Auxiliary to a VFW Post. Extension tools and presentations are available in MALTA Member Resources.

Establishing New Auxiliaries Whether a VFW Post decides on its own that it wants an Auxiliary or whether an Auxiliary member or non-member sees the potential for a new one, the steps for creating an Auxiliary are the same.

- 1. A VFW Post must vote by 2/3 majority to have an Auxiliary. (An Auxiliary can never exist on its own without a Post and can never be started without that Post's permission.)
- 2. The Department President appoints the official organizer of that Auxiliary, and the organizer must be a member of the Auxiliary.
- It would help to allow two others who are knowledgeable with Auxiliary business and work well with others to be on an organizing team. They can answer questions and assist with training, educating, and mentoring the new Auxiliary once it is instituted. It is recommended that the organizer and the organizing teamwork with the Auxiliary and its members for at least a year, or until they are ready to proceed as an Auxiliary in good standing.
- 3. A minimum of 15 eligible applicants must be on the Charter application. Transfers are accepted at the close of the institution and just prior to the installation of the newly formed Auxiliary. The Department Chief of Staff could assist by providing the following tools for the organizer and organizing team:

Revitalization



Maintaining Current Auxiliaries as Healthy Auxiliaries is the focus of Revitalization. I purchased a stoplight for our Department Meetings and for President Amy to take on her District visits. I will display one of three lights: Green, Yellow, or Red at our meetings, so everyone can see how our Department is doing. I know it will be Green at all three meetings!!! Let me explain what each light means:

GREEN LIGHT -YELLOW LIGHT - RED LIGHT

Auxiliaries who are at the **GREEN LIGHT** are healthy Auxiliaries.

YELLOW LIGHT - Auxiliaries are displaying a Red Flag and a caution light, and it is up to the Department Chief of Staff, when requested by the President, to assist the Auxiliary. The District President or Auxiliary Representative must be honest in the assessment of their visit to an Auxiliary and communicate any concerns to the Department President and/or Chief of Staff. This Red Flag could be failure to meet any one or more of the 5 Essentials of an Auxiliary. It could also be a subtle concern for example, attracting no new members, failure to report in Programs, no new officers, not growing, or failure of members to attend District and Department meetings and Department trainings. As soon as the Caution light appears, the Department Chief of Staff needs to work closely with the Department President and observe what is happening on the Auxiliary level - be ready to spring into action. This is the time to step in and OBSERVE the Auxiliary and offer MENTORING. Pick the member or team that fits the Auxiliary – there is no one size fits all. Perhaps mentoring would be the solution and the Auxiliary can get into the GREEN quickly. Mentors might be considered counselors and cheerleaders. Focus on the positives of the Auxiliary and encourage those, while offering guidance and training in areas of concern.

RED LIGHT – the Auxiliary may be put on suspension as a time to step back and regroup. Suspension should not be looked on as a negative thing, it simply means there is some work to do to get the Auxiliary where it needs to be. The hope is that the Auxiliary will recover and come back stronger and better than before.

The National Organization has developed many resources for members to use, including tools available in MALTA Member Resources. These resources have proven to be valuable tools in helping Auxiliaries be more productive.

The Healthy Auxiliary Tool Kit – included in this kit are seven (7) resources to assist Auxiliaries in identifying and solving issues:

- Healthy Auxiliary Checklist
- Healthy Auxiliary Member Questionnaire
- Auxiliary Meeting Clinic
- Communication Phone/Text Tree
- Good Job Certificate
- Healthy Auxiliary Certificate
- VFW Auxiliary Mentoring Guide

Building on the VFW Auxiliary Foundation makes every effort to educate members on all aspects of the duties of Officers at all levels, how to be a Chairman, the why of reporting, etc.

Saving an Auxiliary may be achieved by recruiting new members. Work with your Membership Chairman to help an Auxiliary become Healthy. (No new members = a true Red Flag) (See Membership in MALTA Member Resources for recruiting tools)

Five Essentials of an Auxiliary

The National Organization requires only five (5) things of an Auxiliary:

- 1. Auxiliaries should have at least ten (10) business meetings per year. (Sec. 210, A.) Five (5) members in good standing (of that Auxiliary) shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. (Sec. 212, A.)
- 2. Dues should be paid by at least ten (10) members on or before February 1 of the current year. (Sec. 207, C.)
- 3. Quarterly Audits by Trustees must be submitted. (Sec. 814)
- 4. Officers elected, installed, and reported to National Headquarters no later than June 30. This generates the bond application via email. (Sec. 804A and 806A)
- 5. The offices of President and Treasurer MUST be bonded by August 31. (Sec. 814, E.)

Mentoring for Leadership

Mentoring for Leadership should include training and educating members to be future leaders. We must make sure that the legacy of the VFW Auxiliary continues through strong and healthy Auxiliaries with members who are prepared to take on leadership roles and will continue to move the VFW Auxiliary forward. We can't allow our Auxiliaries to stay "in the past", technology gives us the ability to reach so many more members, which then allows us to continue the tradition and promise to take care of our veterans and their families. As National Chief of Staff Betty Arnold stated, "blend the past with the present to guarantee our future."

- 1. Mentoring helps broaden leadership skills and leadership provides guidance for mentoring members; they work hand in hand.
- 2. A stronger membership will be accomplished through mentoring.
- 3. Through the mentoring process, we can form a friendship with a new member or even a member who has been inactive for a while, thus creating a stronger Auxiliary.
- 4. Utilizing the Mentoring at VFW Auxiliary: Relationship Building for the Future document will help you get started in creating a Program for your Auxiliary.
- 5. Through this Program you will be encouraged to promote the CARE concept.

CARE CONCEPT

- C- Catch a member when they first join.
- **A-** Ask them to participate.
- **R-** Remember what it felt like to be new.
- E- Engage them in a program that fits them.



Over time, this member may express interest in holding an office or chairmanship. Work with them to help them succeed. This will only make the Auxiliary and the organization better. Choose the mentor carefully. If the member is interested in floor work, choose an experienced floor worker, if they are interested in keeping books, have them work with the Secretary or Treasurer.

First off, thank you for taking on the responsibility of being your Auxiliary's Historian and Media Relations Chairman. Secondly, I want to thank Amy Jo for asking me to record her special year and to help promote the projects of the VFW Auxiliary Department of Missouri. I look forward to working with all the Chairmen and providing any assistance needed. My goal is to provide new and old hints, tips and tricks throughout the year to help everyone be successful.

Your responsibility will be to document how your Auxiliary is "Helping Veterans by Bridging the Gap" this year. According to the by-laws, "the Historian shall collect all authentic material pertaining to the history of their Auxiliary, carefully compile the same, and submit a report at the end of the year." You may also choose to use your photos, documentation and storytelling to help provide your president with a memorable keepsake to cherish when looking back at their time as President. This could be a pictorial scrapbook, photobook, digital frame, slideshow or video.



Through Media Relations, you will be the voice of your Auxiliary, its Programs and activities. This can be done through a website, social media, radio, newspapers and local TV. Media Relations is a key role which helps your community understand the significant work your Auxiliary and Post does. This in and of itself is a fantastic way to find additional support for your Auxiliary's Programs and also help grow your Auxiliary's membership.

Resources to help you with your job are plentiful. In MALTA (malta.vfwauxiliary.org) you will find media releases, flyers, social media posts and how-to documents. Check out other organization websites for their promotional materials and tool kits that can be used for awareness months. Don't forget to partner with the other Program Chairmen to help them get the word out about their initiatives, too.

While creating your materials as the Historian & Media Relations Chair remember to obtain the 5 W's (who, what, when, where and why) and provide those with the information you release in order to clearly convey your message. Don't assume people automatically know!

While you are not expected to be a professional photographer please keep in mind the capabilities of your camera, the photo size setting (minimum 1 MB), the framing, arrangement and lighting of your subjects and having a lens clear of smudges and fingerprints (especially with a cell phone camera).

I would love to highlight what the Auxiliaries across Missouri are doing. Please send me a link to your auxiliary's website and/or social media page(s). Also, on social media you can also share with Department and National what you are doing by using the following hashtags in your public social media posts: #VFWAuxMOhistorians, #AuxiliariesInAction or #AuxInAction, #VFWAuxiliary or #VFWAux, #AuxSWAP (Sharing Wonderful Auxiliary Projects), #VFWAuxTBT (Throw Back Thursday).

The first National Home, now the VA's oldest hospital, was opened in Maine in 1866. They provided medical care and long-term housing for Civil War Veterans. These homes were initially to be room and board for disabled veterans. However, by the late 1920s, these homes were providing a level of care comparable to hospital care and in 1930; President Hoover created the Veterans Administration to consolidate all veteran services. And we were there! In 1928, the Hospital Program became the second National Program adopted by the VFW Auxiliary. We as hospital volunteers have spent over 100 years donating millions of hours offering smiles, compassion, aid, comfort, dollars, etc., to our veterans. The way we volunteer today is much different from our beginnings.

Volunteer Recruitment, Recognition and Support:

New volunteers are needed every day across our nation to step up and carry on the work that our older members started. Missouri has seven (7) Veterans Homes. It is imperative that we get the word out about the need for new volunteers because the need is greater than ever.

Be confident and share your positive experiences and your joy as working as a hospital volunteer. Your testimony is one of your best recruiting tools. Additionally, do not just share with your fellow members but with family, neighbors, friends, youth groups; reach out into your community to educate them about volunteering for our veterans.







101% + by June 30, 2025

Remember, that Department membership goals are based on your current membership quota NOT paid membership. For the Department to reach the goals set forth by National we must reach above and beyond. If we meet the above goals then **WE WILL** not only meet National's membership goals, but **WE WILL** exceed National's membership goals! How exciting would that be?

It is imperative to meet these goals to increase our squadron's strength to meet the current and future challenges our veterans will combat. Every increase in membership is one more voice we have in Washington to make sure bills are passed that benefit our veterans.

DEPARTMENT MEMBERSHIP AWARDS

Good news auxiliaries! This year there will be **NO online reporting necessary for the membership program!** Which also means there will be **no year-end awards**. **What?** Instead, I will be giving out awards **all year long! YOU** get an award, and **YOU** get an award, everyone gets an award...well probably not but I can hope! The following awards will be presented at each of the fall and winter conference meetings and at the June 2025 convention meeting.

AWARDS FOR MEMBERS

Recruiter's Wings Award – given to the Auxiliary member who recruits the most new members or rejoined members since the last meeting. This outstanding recruiter will receive \$25 and a citation. **Auxiliary treasurers are not eligible for this award.**

VFW Recruiter's Wings Award – given to the VFW member who recruits the most new Auxiliary members or rejoined members since the last meeting. This outstanding recruiter will receive \$25 and a citation.

AWARDS FOR AUXILIARIES

Top-Flight Ace Award- given to the Auxiliaries that meet all Department membership goals since the last meeting. All eligible Auxiliaries will receive a citation and be put into drawings for a chance to win \$50.

Recruitment Star – given to the Auxiliaries that have had at least one membership drive since the last Department meeting. Photos and documentation of the membership drive must be emailed to the Membership Major ("Chairman") at least two weeks prior to any Department meeting to be considered for this award. Eligible Auxiliaries will receive a citation and be put into drawings for a chance to win \$50.

Remember, effective communication is essential in recruitment, and understanding our unit's purpose and mission helps convey its significance to prospective members.

WHY should someone join our organization?

- To contribute to the well-being of our veterans, service members and their families.
- To enhance one's skillset and professional growth.
- To establish valuable connections and foster camaraderie
- To access essential services and support, including insurance coverage, grants and discounts.

We've developed a fresh new QR Code for recruitment purposes. It's deployable at recruiting events and can be affixed to recruitment posters. This allows potential members swift and convenient access to membership resources. No longer do you need to generate hard copies of this information, which often end up discarded.

Remember, clear communication is essential, especially when conveying technical details to potential recruits.

ATTRACTING YOUNGER MEMBERS

Attention Auxiliary members and Post members! Our mission: to enlist the next wave of Auxiliary warriors. There's a vast pool of eligible candidates waiting for our call to duty. The recent conclusion of the 20-year Middle East conflict has left us with staggering numbers of potential recruits, but, here's the challenge: it's not about a shortage of prospects; it's about igniting enthusiasm and understanding about our organization. We must adapt our approach to attract these young members. Think like our fellow veterans and their families.

Many juggle time constraints due to young children and busy schedules. So, how do we reach them? No longer can we rely solely on post events or community invitations. We must meet them where they are—conveniently and purposefully. Remember, they are the future of our organization. It's time to reshape ourselves, evolve and become something better.

Our continuing mission: to engage the next generation strategically. Young members could care less about a bake sale, a blood drive, bingo night, or monthly breakfast at the post. So, where do they reside these days? They'd rather text than talk on the phone; they thrive in virtual events and meetings; and social media is their daily playground.

Our organization must adapt and meet them WHERE THEY ARE. Here's how:

- 1. **Innovate**: Break free from the old mindset—"that's how it's always been done." If we don't evolve, we won't endure as an organization.
- 2. **Tech Allies**: Tap into tech-savvy members or their tech-savvy offspring. Even if they're not eligible for membership, their support matters.
- 3. **Social Media Surge**: If we're not there already, establish a robust social media presence. Regular posts—minimum once a week—keep interest alive.
- 4. **Electronic Outreach**: Communicate events via text, email and social media. Let's bridge the gap and shape our future."*

Where can we find these new, younger members? Most of them are related to current members of the Auxiliary and Post members.

Here's our plan:

- 1. **Member Intel**: Have your members compile a list of potential recruits.
 - Column A: Family members you KNOW are eligible to join. Consider gifting them membership.
 - o Column B: Family members who MAY be eligible. This is a chance to reconnect.
- 2. **Doubling Down**: Imagine if each of us recruited just one new member—our organization would double in size within a year!
- 3. **The Power of ASK**: Don't underestimate the simple act of asking. When you meet someone new, inquire if they would consider joining our ranks. Find out if they share our passion for helping veterans.
- 4. **Eligibility Check**: Determine if they're eligible to join. Focus on finding passionate individuals who align with our cause. An engaged member is a valuable asset.
- 5. **Active Engagement**: Once they're on board, encourage their participation. Together, we'll shape our future.

How do we ensure active participation from our new recruits? Let's break it down:

- 1. **New Member Orientation Checklist**: Implement this essential tool. It's our compass for guiding fresh recruits through their initial steps.
- 2. **Talent Recon**: Identify their unique talents and skills. Each member brings something valuable to the table.
- 3. **Communication Channels**: Tailor our approach to their preferences. Whether it's email, text, or carrier pigeon, we'll meet them where they're most comfortable.
- 4. **New Member Packet**: Assemble a comprehensive packet. It's their induction into our ranks—a roadmap to understanding our mission, values and expectations.

When assembling new member packets, let's ensure they are well-equipped for their journey. Here's our checklist:

- 1. **Bylaw Briefing**: Include a concise updated bylaw book. It's their compass for understanding our rules and regulations.
- 2. **Acronyms & Jargon**: Demystify our language. Provide an Acronyms & Common Terminology guide—essential for navigating our conversations.
- 3. MALTA Maneuver: Help them create a MALTA login. It's their gateway to our digital realm.
- 4. **Welcome Dispatch**: Send a personalized "Welcome" email or letter. Make them feel part of our squadron from day one.
- 5. **Benefits Blueprint**: Detail their Membership Benefits. Show them the perks of joining our ranks
- 6. **Tradition Transmission**: Share our Auxiliary traditions. These rituals bind us together.
- 7. **Officer Intel**: Provide contact information for Auxiliary officers, Department officers and National officers. They are their go-to allies.
- 8. **Program Overview**: Educate them on VFW Auxiliary National Programs by including a VFW Auxiliary National Programs: An Overview. It's our mission in action.
- 9. VFW Store Recon: Include the VFW Store Flyer/website/catalog. Gear up for duty!
- 10. **Recruitment Roll Call**: Attach a current membership application. It's their ticket to enlistment of other new members.

Create a membership team:

Your mission: to assemble a dynamic membership squadron within your Auxiliary. The treasurer alone cannot shoulder the burden of recruiting new members or retaining our current ranks.

Your team must be strategic and comprehensive. Here's the blueprint:

- 1. **Dues Dispatch**: Contact current members about annual dues (Dues Notice). Keep the financial engines running smoothly.
- 2. **Reconnect Recon**: Reach out to former members. Encourage them to rejoin our ranks. Let's reignite their passion.
- 3. **Recruitment Rally**: Set dates for recruitment events—aim for at least four. These are our frontline engagements.
- 4. **Mentor Matchup**: Assign mentors within your Auxiliary. Active members guiding the next generation.
- 5. **MALTA Maneuver**: Conduct a MALTA training. Teach them how to pay dues seamlessly. Our digital arsenal awaits.
- 6. **Roster Revamp**: Clean up rosters—remove deceased members and correct bad addresses. Streamline our forces.
- 7. **Training Summit**: Hold a Membership Training Session. Equip them with knowledge and camaraderie.

Remember, our strength lies in unity. Together, we'll shape the future of our organization!

Encourage attending District and Department meetings:

Let's rally our forces for District and Department meetings. The more intel our members gather, the more active and engaged they'll become.

Here's our battle plan:

- 1. **Lunch Recon**: Offer to buy lunch for first-time attendees. It's a gesture of camaraderie and ensures they feel welcomed.

- 4. **District Deployment**: Remember, those who engage at the District level are more likely to soar to Department meetings and beyond.

- 4. **VFW Auxiliary Recruiter Drawing** for each VFW Auxiliary National Membership Achievement Award winner. Winners will be entered into a drawing to receive one \$500 Visa gift card.

Veterans & Military Suicide Prevention and Mental Health Awareness

Veterans & Military Suicide Prevention is our president's special project this year. Every day in the United States, 22 veterans succumb to suicide — losing their personal battle to invisible wounds of war. We need to stand up to do something to help veterans struggling with PTSD. We as an Auxiliary need to help our veterans and their families to find the tools to help themselves. We need to help our Veterans bridge the gap to help with their suicide/mental health awareness. Be mindful of the characteristics associated with thoughts of suicide and be watchful of our veterans' mental health. One veteran lost to suicide is one veteran too many!

What will you do for our veterans, service members and their families this year?

Childcare for Active-Duty Service Members

As we serve diligently toward our mission of serving veterans, we often overlook those the veterans support themselves -their children. A special focus on this year's Veterans & Family Support Program is giving back to these families. Maybe it's babysitting for a few hours a week, providing for the babies and toddlers or maybe just being emotional support for the spouse left behind to take care of the family. By being a confident for service member's family, our members are providing that much more peace for our active-duty military.

National and Missouri Veterans Service Programs

The VFW's National and Missouri Veterans Service helps veterans, service members and their families obtain the benefits they deserve - at no cost to the veteran. NVS/MSV provides a nationwide network of nearly 300 VFW Service Officers who help veterans navigate the Veterans Affairs system. Those VFW Service Officers recover more than \$1 billion annually in VA benefits for veterans and their dependents.

These highly skilled professionals assist all veterans, whether they are VFW members or not, in filing claims for:

- Disability compensation.
- Rehabilitation and educational programs.
- Pension and death benefits.
- Employment and training programs.

NVS/MVS also works to ensure veterans receive quality, timely and accessible VA health care, including:

- Hospital care.
- Outpatient care.
- Specialized health care for female veterans.
- Alcohol and drug dependency treatment.
- Medical evaluation for disorders associated with military service, exposure to Agent Orange, radiation or other environmental hazards.

VFW Veterans & Military Support Program

Veterans & Military Support contains programs initiated by the VFW: Military Assistance Program (MAP), Unmet Needs and the VFW "Sport Clips® Help A Hero Scholarship." These programs serve active-duty and recently discharged military.

Military Assistance Program

The Military Assistance Program (MAP) helps VFW and Auxiliary members give more to their local military units by providing funds to connect with troops. It helps forge and nurture bonds with those units by providing financial assistance for Posts, Districts and Departments to sponsor morale-boosting send-offs, homecomings, and casual get-togethers.

Post and Auxiliaries participating in Adopt-a-Unit and Family Readiness Group events can also receive assistance. MAP keeps care packages circulating by covering postage costs.

Our youth are the future of our country. They are impressionable, and we as Auxiliary members are in a unique position to mold and teach our young people the principles upon which our nation was founded. We can lead by example while serving our veterans, service members and their families.

Sponsoring and Working with Youth Groups

As part of the Auxiliary Youth Activities Program, an Auxiliary can sponsor a youth group and engage youth in any of our programs, including activities to honor and assist our veterans and their families. Recruit within your local schools and youth organizations that may require volunteer or community service hours for advancements, school credits or service hours.

- School clubs
- Youth sports teams
- After school programs
- Home School Association
- Church youth groups
- Scouting programs

- Youth community service groups
- Nonprofit organization youth advisory councils And so many more!

Never forget, involving youth can bring new membership! When you involve entire families, they feel welcome and included. If children can help at an event, remember to act responsibly and respectfully around them. They are watching and learning from you.

Patriotism Through Literacy

This program helps us promote and encourages our youth through literacy. We have the ability to introduce historical figures and teach them about events in our nation's history, all while fostering a love of books that leads to a lifetime of learning.

Some examples of way you can participate are:

- When visiting a VA or nursing home see if the staff can set up a reading area for the youth and veterans can read to each other.

Illustrating America

The Illustrating America Art Contest is open to any student in grades K-8 who is enrolled in public, private, or parochial school or home study program in the United States, its territories and possessions, or dependents of U.S. military or civilian personnel in overseas schools. Students must be U.S. citizen or lawful U.S, permanent resident. Foreign exchange students and students age 15 or older are ineligible. National grade division winners of previous Illustrating American contests may enter the subsequent grade division but are ineligible for the same grade division of which they are a previous National winner.

- √ Entries will be judged on patriotic theme and technique.
- √ Contest will consist of three grade divisions: K-2, 3-5, and 6-8
- √ Entries must be received by Auxiliaries by March 31, 2025.
- V First place winner from each grade division due to Department by April 15, 2025.
