1. Non-payment of dues prior to December 31. Once relieved from office, the member may not be re-elected or appointed to any position until the member's dues are paid.

Sec. 210 -

B. A change in the regular monthly business meeting date, time, or location shall be approved by a two thirds (2/3) vote of the Auxiliary members present at such meeting.

1. Notification of such change shall be sent to all of its Auxiliary members, the National, Department, and District Secretaries within ten (10) calendar days.

OUTREACH definition: out reach *noun* / 'out rēCH/ 1. the extent or length of reaching out

The Auxiliary Out reach program is all about REACHING OUT to the groups, churches, schools and other organizations in your community to see what YOU (both as an Auxiliary and as an individual) can do to MAKE A DIFFERENCE by volunteering your time to help them.

For the approaching holiday seasons, remember "Thanks for Giving" to your community. Research to see who in your area will be providing dinners or pantry items for home cooked meals for those in need and volunteer your cooking, serving and cleaning skills to help out, remembering to wear your Auxiliary identifiers.

As Christmas (or any other observed December holidays) approaches, check with your local Goodwill, Salvation Army, shelters hospitals, etc. to see if there are programs they are doing that you can be a part of to help shop, wrap and/or deliver gifts, and assist in putting together food baskets or clothing donations for those in need.

Do you have a church in your area who may be hosting a blood drive? Offer to help register donors, serve snacks and donate to the cause yourself. This time of the year, the blood banks run low.

Contact the organizers of your local holiday parades: Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving and/or Christmas to see if they can use help in the parade lineups, shuttling people, judging entries, etc.

Remember to keep these things in mind when participating in and reporting your Auxiliary Outreach project:

- The project must be voted on by the membership. If this is a recurring volunteer project, put it in your standing rules.
- Wear your Auxiliary shirts, pins, hats or anything else that will identify who you are.
- Report your projects as soon as possible following the event and include the number of members who participated and the total number of hours involved. Reporting right after the event will ensure that nothing is forgotten. **You DO NOT report any monetary values in Auxiliary Outreach. This is a VOLUNTEER program.**
- If you have a recurring project that is multiple times a month, you may accumulate those hours and report them one time at the end of the month. In your description, please include the dates that your Auxiliary or member participated in.
- Be creative and descriptive when reporting the project. Did something fun and unexpected happen? Report it so you will catch my eye!

Don’t forget the cards!! The National Home will be celebrating 100 years of helping veterans and their families this year and they would love to receive birthday cards from all over. Make a trip to your local school, teach them about the National Home and have the kids get creative with some birthday card making.

Don’t forget! Our Winter C of A will be here before we know it! Our “Buddy”® Poppy Display Contest is: “MO on the move” poster contest explaining the history of the “Buddy”® Poppy.

Fun facts about the Buddy Poppy/ National Home Chairmanship-

- Madame Anna E Guérin, founder of the American and French Children's League, spoke at servicemen's organizations and always requested the same thing: whenever possible, wear a silk red poppy flower to honor the fallen.
- In August of 1922, the poppy was adopted as the official memorial flower of the VFW.
- From 1940-1961 there were "Buddy"® Poppy Girls. Some of these Buddy Poppy Girls autographed photos of themselves to distribute to Posts for selling the poppies. **Does your Post have one of these autographed photos?**
- Take a **field trip to "Flanders Field."**
 - Post/Auxiliary 2210 believes they have one of the cannons from Flanders Field. They hope to soon have a mural behind it on their wall.
- In November 1925, the Board of Trustees had their first annual meeting. At that meeting, the groundbreaking ceremony was held for the first building at National Home. That building was financed by the VFW baseball trust fund.
- In 1957 the National Home had 29 cottages and 200 children living there. The Department of Michigan Auxiliary donated money to build a housemother's cottage where they could go on their day off to rest without children. When Mr. Charles Henry, Manager of the Home was asked why a housemother needed time away from the children when some were their own, he replied, "Mothers could do a better job if they could have a day each week of relief from the worry and frustrations of taking care of a large family, be it their own or others."
- The original Welcome Center structure at the National Home was paid for by a baseball game and careful investments. In 1922, the New York Yankees were playing the Giants in the World Series. The game was called due to darkness and both fans and writers said it was collusion to make more money on another game. Judge K. M. Landis, then commissioner, ordered the money be turned over to charity. Past Commander-in-Chief Tillinghast Huston, at the time was a part owner of the Yankees. He was able to secure \$20,352.10 of the proceeds for the VFW and it was turned over to the National Home. The money was then invested and 25 years later they had the \$60,000 needed to build the Administration building.

Have you contacted unaffiliated posts and explained the importance of having an Auxiliary? If you have an unaffiliated Post that has expressed an interest in establishing an Auxiliary, please let Department know ASAP. It's important to establish new Auxiliaries to help carry out our mission of helping veterans and their families.

Revitalization

At the Council of Administration meeting, I asked those in attendance, how many had used the **Healthy Auxiliary Tool Kit**, and to my surprise, almost everyone raised their hands. Keep up the good work! There are wonderful resources to use in MALTA. Check them out! Another great tool to use is the **Member Engagement Form**. It's a good form to have new members fill out and should be in the New Member packet. At an Auxiliary meeting, take a few minutes and have the members in attendance fill out an updated form. Our interests change over time and we want to make sure we have the most current information on our members when we are looking for volunteers for our projects.

With the holidays right around the corner, I encourage the Auxiliaries to contact members that aren't attending meetings to see if there is anything they need. Have they been ill? Do they no longer drive at night but would like to attend meetings if they had a ride? Or do they feel not needed? It's so easy to do a wellness check with just a phone call and with this small gesture, you are letting them know they are still in our thoughts and important to us. Everyone wants to feel needed!

REMEMBER, GREEN is the color you want to be!!

Mentoring

I now have all our District Mentoring Teams in place except for two and those will be set up by the end of the month!! Thank you, District Presidents, for doing this!!

These teams not only help the Department financially, but more importantly, they could help an Auxiliary having problems. It is **extremely** important that we get help to an Auxiliary that may be struggling early before the problems become major! That's why the District Presidents official visits are so important! These visits will let both the District and Department know know if an Auxiliary might be showing subtle "yellow caution lights". This would be the time to send in a member of the Mentoring Team to help before the problem becomes major and the Auxiliary possibly face suspension.

SOLD OUT EVENT!

Creating a Facebook event offers a robust platform for organizing gatherings and promoting events. It provides a centralized hub for sharing event details, inviting attendees, and providing updates. By leveraging these tools, you can effectively nurture your event and maximize its success.

As a Page, you can invite your followers, while your personal Profile allows you to extend invitations to your friends. Once people indicate their interest, they'll typically receive notifications when you post updates in the event discussion area. When a fan indicates interest in your event this also is posted in their newsfeed where their friends will see it. This helps maintain engagement and keeps your event top of mind.

Facebook events facilitate seamless communication and engagement among participants

Capturing the Event

Have the MC or host remind attendees during the event that a group photo will be taken after the main activities. This will encourage guests to stay and participate. Capture the team's hard work by taking a group photo before or after the event setup. This is a great way to recognize their efforts. Emphasize the importance of visibility. Remind attendees that if they can't see you, you can't see them in the photo. Encourage them to move around freely without the need for time consuming staging. To avoid missed moments, take several photos. This will help ensure that everyone's eyes are open, mouths are closed, and smiles are captured. Pay attention to the background of your photos. Avoid clutter or distracting elements that can detract from the photo. Finally, for smartphones, avoid using digital zoom, as it can result in grainy images. Instead, take the photo at a normal distance and crop it later.

through comments, posts, and shared media. This can foster excitement and anticipation, ultimately driving increased attendance and a more enriching experience for everyone involved.

Unlike regular Facebook Posts that can get lost on the Page or newsfeed, events remain pinned to the top of your Page, making them easily discoverable for those seeking information. This ensures your event details are prominently displayed and accessible to potential attendees.

You can add additional hosts to the event. It will then appear on the added hosts' Pages, enabling them to invite their followers and create event posts, expanding your reach and engagement.

By utilizing Facebook events, you can effectively organize, promote, and engage with your audience, creating memorable and successful gatherings.



Tips and Tricks

Facebook Event Photo

Size event photos to 1920 x 1005 pixels, or a 16:9 aspect ratio. Keep info in the center to avoid it being cropped off on mobile devices.

Putting your photos into an album makes it much easier to find them later. Don't forget to label those photos for future members!

Online reporting is the only way to do any reporting. You can do that at www.vfwauxmo.org Click members only, sign in with your auxiliary number and your password is your last name lowercase. Once there, go to reporting and fill out EVERY part of the report. If things are missing you will be asked to resubmit the report to fill in what is missing. National Legislative Priorities


 **HR 8371** – Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act. So Veterans, caregivers, and survivors can receive the life-altering and life-saving care and benefits they have earned and deserve.

 **Unaddressed Toxic Exposures** – Require VA to publicly post announcements, updates, and current statuses of research pertaining to presumptive conditions from service-connected exposures.

- Conduct oversight hearing to ensure VA’s compliance with the PACT Act for the ongoing evaluation of conditions associated with toxic exposures.


 **Exploring Alternative PTSD Treatments** – Provide funding to the Department of Defense and VA for innovative PTSD treatments currently used in the private sector.

- Direct VA to perform studies on alternative PTSD and other mental health care treatments.

 **Pass S 740/HR 1139 – Guard VA Benefits Act** – to reinstate penalties for charging veterans and survivors unauthorized fees relating to claims for VA benefits.

Legislative Priorities for the upcoming 2024-2025 Legislative Year


 Fully fund the Missouri Veterans Commission (MVC)


- Yearly MVC must go back to general revenue to support the VSOs, state cemeteries and state veterans homes. \$50 million last year

Missouri Association of Military Organizations (MAVO)

Legislative Priorities for the upcoming 2024-2025 Legislative Year

 Enhance real and personal property tax exemptions for 100% disabled veterans. Currently there is a tax exemption for veterans that are 100% disabled **and** are former prisoners of war. This narrow exemption provides assistance to very few Missouri veterans, change **and** to **or**. This would be a constitutional change.

 Support legislation that protects veterans from predatory actors who seek to profit from benefits that have been earned by those who serve our nation (Claim Sharks). MVC VSOs and their grant partners receive no payment taken from the veterans benefits.

 Support voting “no” on Amendment 2, which would allow the Missouri Gaming Commission to regulate licensed sports wagering. The reason is this will decline the revenue generated by the riverboat gaming and our posts gambling machines.

MEMBERSHIP AT DISTRICT MEETINGS

Ideas to incorporate the membership program into your district meetings:

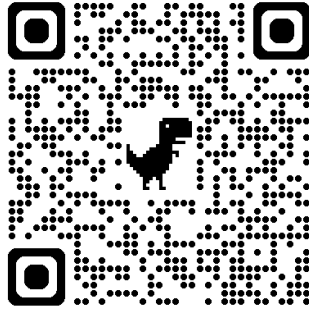
G.A.P. MEMBERSHIP METHOD
