Ask Amy

Susan from Auxiliary #5555 asked," My Auxiliary has purchased a refrigerator for their Bingo kitchen supplies and put it in the Post: the VFW is now disbanding. Will the Auxiliary retain ownership of the refrigerator or does the Post assume ownership?"

Hello, Susan from #5555, this is a great question, at National Convention we passed a **Resolution** (#13) a to help clarify property issues like this (see the details below).

The Auxiliary will retain ownership of the refrigerator (**Sec 920D Property Ownership**) and will need to determine its future owner, or sale by a majority vote when finalizing the business of your Auxiliary. See **Sec.208B Auxiliary to a Disbanded Post.**

Section 920. Property Ownership.

A. Auxiliaries, Districts and Departments own personal property acquired by it and retain ownership until disposed of by a majority vote, unless otherwise provided in these Bylaws or Booklet of Instruction.

B. For the purposes of these Bylaws, **personal property is defined** as tangible and intangible property that is movable, even if a small amount of disassembly is required to move.

C. For the purposes of these Bylaws, **real property is defined** as land and permanent structures on the land.

D. Auxiliary, District or Department personal property placed in or on real property or facility owned or operated by a VFW organization that is not being donated to the VFW organization shall remain the property of the Auxiliary, District or Department.

E. Personal property acquired by an Auxiliary, District or Department and donated by majority vote of the Auxiliary, District or Department with intent for the item to remain with the real property or facility owned or operated by a VFW organization shall belong to the VFW organization.

F. Personal property donated to a VFW organization by a majority vote of an Auxiliary, District or Department may not be reclaimed by the Auxiliary, District or Department without consent of the VFW organization.

September 11, Patriot Day (National Day of Service and Remembrance). A day so many of us remember, one that I cry every year remembering the lives lost and the war after.



- Take information about the <u>Smart/Maher Teacher of the</u> <u>Year Award</u> to your local school(s) and give them to the Principal for distribution.

Frequently Asked Questions

• Does it cost the Post anything?

The VFW Auxiliary Charter Kit fee is \$100.00. The Post and/or Department and/or the interested, eligible applicants may pay the Charter fee. The Charter fee accompanies the completed Charter application.

• How long does it take to start?

From the time your Post votes to have an Auxiliary, it could take from two (2) to four (4) months to get an Auxiliary up and running.

Ready to Add an Auxiliary to your Post?

- In accordance with the VFW Bylaws, a notice is to be mailed or emailed to each Post member advising them that members will be voting on having an Auxiliary and that the vote will take place at a specific meeting.
- In accordance with the VFW Bylaws, a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the Post members present is required to set into action the formation of a new Auxiliary to that Post.
- Inform the Department President of the approval and the Department President will then assign an Auxiliary Organizer who will work on obtaining the required number of charter members (15) and filling out necessary paperwork.

ELEMENT MISSING!

Confusion has reigned ever since a vital element went missing. Concerned citizens have furiously been searching for answers. A few clues have been found but the burning question remains: WHY?!

That is correct, Why is missing! I see it absent in many stories by different organizations.

The Why is an essential element of the 5-Ws for a story (Who, What, When, Were, Why). The Why can drive interest and understanding.

People may be more likely to support your event if they know why it is happening or why you need to raise money. It's a hook!

One of Why's cohorts is Where. It is innocently left out of stories assuming everyone knows where the organization is located.

What if Uncle Eddie in another town shares a flyer from your

Facebook post, sparking interest, but the only info is your Post/Auxiliary name, lacking a town or address?

We also don't want to overlook the element of Who. If people are not familiar with the VFW or Auxiliary, they may not know who you are or who you are addressing. Is your event or activity open to the public or just members? Tell them!

Lastly, I love being able to share the different ideas our Auxiliaries have around the state. When I do, an important associate of the 5-Ws is How. The How helps others who may be interested in doing something similar.

Keep your audience informed and engaged by using the essential elements: who, what, when, where, why, (and how). Apply the 5 Ws (and H) to every article, flyer, and social media post. Don't leave your audience guessing!

Perfecting Photographic Evidence

They say a picture is worth a thousand words, and in the fast-paced world of social media and journalism, it rings truer than ever. Our brains are wired to process visuals at lightning speed—60,000 times faster than text. This means a captivating image can instantly grab attention and entice readers to delve deeper into your story.

When using stock photos for your material, always ensure they're royalty-free and not copyrighted. Numerous websites offer high-quality images at no cost (see sidebar).

If you're using your own photos, explore the editing capabilities of your smartphone or photo app. Many offer features like auto-enhance, background blur, spot removal, and even basic markup tools to elevate your images.

For the perfect photo, pay attention to your surroundings. Choose a clear background with good lighting and clean your camera lens. Adjust your phone's size settings, and make sure everyone is visible in the frame.

How to Participate in Candidate Forums

Members can make a difference in any election by getting involved in the political process. Hold voter registration drives, town hall meetings, and other events featuring candidates for public office. Veterans and Auxiliary members are a strong voting block and a constituency that most candidates want on their side. As we approach the next election cycle, here are a few items to keep mind as you get involved and attend or host candidate functions and town hall meetings:

DO's

Do attend candidate town hall meetings and other events and ask candidates where they stand on our issues.

Do set up voter registration drives /Get Out the Vote Campaigns on the local level.

© Do provide carpool service on Election Day to help the elderly and disabled get to the voting booth.

Do support and work for your favorite candidates as an individual voting constituent.

© Do wear your VFW/Auxiliary cap/shirt at public events such as town halls, rallies, forums, or debates.

DON'Ts

Do not endorse candidates on behalf of the VFW/Auxiliary National Organization, Department, District or Post.

Do not wear your VFW/Auxiliary cap/shirt when actively campaigning for a candidate, such as soliciting donations or knocking on doors asking people to pledge their vote for a candidate. The key is to stay informed on veterans' issues and use your influence to urge new candidates and those up for reelection to support veterans.

It does not matter which candidates you support if they know you are a VFW/Auxiliary member and are concerned about your fellow veterans, service members, and their families.

Grassroots Efforts in the State of MO

Grassroots support refers to the organic, bottom-up backing of our Veterans. This is deeply rooted in Post and Districts. It relies on the active participation of our Auxiliaries to dedicate their time and energy because they believe in the support of Veterans issues. Engagement is the cornerstone of any grassroots effort. It involves actively participating in or sponsoring local events, town halls and meetings, and engaging in public forums where our state legislatures will hear your voice in support of Veterans. Ask them the tough questions, fully funding of the Missouri Veterans Commission, support of bills by cosponsoring, movement of bills through committees. This not only increases your visibility but also helps the community in understanding the efforts.

Mental Health First Aid®

This is an 8 hour, skills-based training that teaches people how to identify, understand and respond to signs and symptoms of a mental health or substance use challenge in adults ages 18 and over. The evidence behind the program demonstrates that it builds mental health literacy, providing an action plan that teaches people to safely and responsibly identify and address a potential mental health or substance use challenge. The course is offered in person or virtually.

We have the opportunity to include Youth in so many ways within each of our programs. Your chairmen and members can work together to find unique ways to do that. Below are two examples of promoting Youth Activities within another program.



The "Buddy"® Poppy Contest at the Fall Council of Administration this year will be a Christmas ornament contest and will include a division for Youth. The theme for the ornaments will be Patriotic and there will be two categories: Made by Youth (age 15 and below) and made by an Adult (age 16 and up). Ornament can be any size/shape. (Remember it must be able to hang on a tree.)

Make sure you have at least one Poppy in its original form with a tag on the ornament. Include an envelope with Adult or Youth on outside and on the inside put Auxiliary number, number of members, number of poppies used, number of hours spent making ornament. DO NOT add anything to your ornament that will identify the person or Auxiliary that made it.
