As the Patriotic Instructor, you have been appointed to this high office to provide leadership in promoting patriotism within our organization, as well as inform, educate, and promote patriotism among the community.

Here are some key duties of the Patriotic Instructor:

- Shall see that the room is in keeping with the Ritual
- Shall instruct the members in the proper use of and salute to the Flag
- Shall maintain a record of all patriotic days and initiate programs for their proper observance and perform such other duties as the President may require
- May carry the Flag in events and parades
- Shall assist in the floor work ceremonies
- Shall see that the pledge to the Flag is given properly and that due respect to the Flag is observed at all times by members
- The Patriotic Instructor should instruct new members how to stand at attention, parade rest, etc.
- The Patriotic Instructor should also try to read some portion of the Bylaws at every meeting

While the cold winter months may keep us indoors, this is the perfect time to plan ahead for spring. Think of it as gathering your companions — like the Scarecrow, Tin Man, and Lion — each bringing their own strengths to the cause. Together, we can prepare fundraisers, organize “Buddy®” Poppy distributions, and build partnerships with schools, churches, and civic groups.



The “Buddy®” Poppy is our ruby slipper: small but powerful, carrying the story of sacrifice and remembrance wherever it goes. Seasonal Adventures on the Road Ahead

Use the time to make tray favors for Veterans and prepare creative entries for the Winter Conference of Administration “Buddy®” Poppy Contest. This is a wonderful way to start the year with fellowship, creativity, and service.


Fundraiser Idea: Have you ever seen a store display little papers with an organization’s logo, where donors write their names and the papers are hung up to show support? Why not do the same with a “Buddy®” Poppy design. Provide the store with printed poppy

papers, and each time someone donates, they write their name on one to hang up. It's a simple, visible way to raise money for the Auxiliary (or whichever cause the fundraiser supports), while spreading awareness of the "Buddy®" Poppy mission.

- **February – National Salute to Veteran Patients & Valentine’s Day:** Share "Buddy®" Poppies as tokens of love and gratitude. Create Valentine cards adorned with "Buddy®" Poppies to deliver to Veteran patients, spreading joy and remembrance.
- **Spring Planning:** Like planting poppies in the fields of Oz, organize spring "Buddy®" Poppy distributions that bloom across your community. Pair each "Buddy®" Poppy with a short message explaining its meaning, ensuring every recipient understands the story behind the flower.

 - A storytelling session where children learn about military families, framed as an Oz-style adventure of resilience.
 - Art or essay contests themed around "There's No Place Like Home," connecting the National Home's mission to the famous Oz phrase.
 - Youth-led "Buddy®" Poppy distributions, giving kids a chance to walk their own yellow brick road of service and remembrance.

FACEBOOK

Facebook is one of the most popular social media platforms. It connects billions of people across the globe. It was launched in 2004 and has evolved into what we see today.

Facebook is a must have if you do not have a website. As of 30 November, there are 21 auxiliaries in the state that have reported that they have a Facebook page since the 1st of May. **Be sure to fill out an online report if you have a Facebook account for your auxiliary.**


Establishing a Facebook page is practical and an effective way for the VFW Auxiliary to strengthen its communication, increase its reach, and further the mission of supporting veterans. It is FREE, and

Why have a Facebook page -

By keeping a public presence on Facebook, your Auxiliary can reach a wider audience, including the younger generations of veterans and potential supporters who may not be aware of the organization’s mission. This visibility can help attract new members, volunteers, and donors.

Through post, comments and messages, a Facebook page enables meaningful interaction with members and the broader community. It can be used to educate the public about veterans’ issue – the Richard Star Act is one of those that the VFW and its Auxiliary have been watching closely. You can share information about fundraisers, scholarships contests, and upcoming events like the Valentine’s Day Dance and Dinner.

It's easy to get started – first set up your Facebook account. If you need help setting up a Facebook account, here is a helpful QR code:



easy to set up and keep, thus stretching the budget. Now, what is next now that you have a Facebook page? You need to go to Meta Business Suite – a free all-in-one tool that helps you manage your online presence and link the account.

It is recommended that you have at least 2 people who have access as Administrators. Explore the dashboard and see the different sections – home, post, ads, insights, etc. You can even plan your content to schedule post ahead of time.

Check your inbox regularly to respond to messages and comments. Engaging with your audience helps build relationships and trust. Be on the lookout for inappropriate comments (like political comments or hate speech), spammers or scammers. The Administrators is the only one who can hide and/or block the information.

Now, I'd like to talk to you about the National Award – a citation and \$25 is available to one Auxiliary in each program group with the most outstanding social media reel highlighting Auxiliary in Action.

I provided instructions on how to create a reel in the November/December material. I also took time to get with various individuals during down time at the fall Department meeting in Osage Beach. Feel free to reach out to me and if someone is close by, I will give you contact information. If not, I will do my best to talk to you through the process.

Yet, how will you get the reel to me? You will need to email me – send me a link (just as you would send any other) along with completed and signed form that is available on the Department website. It must be turned in by **31 March 2026**.



Happy New Year! The Holiday Season is now behind us and a brand-new year of 2026 is ahead of us. Now is not the time to sit back and take it easy.

Have you heard of the Medical Foster Home Program? When living at home becomes difficult, some people prefer to remain in a home-like setting rather than move to a nursing home. In moments like these, the VA Medical Foster Home (MFH) is here to help. MFH is a voluntary option that assists in matching veterans with approved MFH caregivers to provide care in a family home. The veterans receive appropriate oversight provided by the VA MFH and Home-Based Primary Care. Payment for the care will be made by the veteran to the caregiver, and the cost of care will be based on the veteran's care needs and financial resources. Caregivers must have prior experience (formal or informal) and have the compassion and motivation to provide 24/7 supervision to the veteran placed in their home. To ensure safety and quality of care, there are multiple steps and training requirements to become a VA MFH caregiver. Is this something your family would be interested in providing?

February gives us Valentine's Day and Presidents' Day. What will you be doing for those in hospital or nursing homes? National Ambassador Kim Copson said, "Go to your local VA hospital or clinic and collaborate with the staff. Perhaps they are hosting a party at which you can participate. This is great start, but sometimes we become so focused on an event we have, we forget about others. Your Auxiliary does not have to limit your focus on one event. Contact several medical facilities in your area and find out ways you can pitch in."



Continue to report. All your hard work deserves to be counted, and the reports show just how much you are doing for our most vulnerable veterans. As of this writing (11/21/25) you have reported the following: 345 Projects, 6,604 hours volunteered by 1,135 members. You have donated \$67,503.64 throughout the Department. Continue to report. There are 41 Auxiliaries that have not reported in the Hospital Program. Our year will be over before we know it.

As we walk this yellow brick road toward veterans' healthcare needs, let us be ever mindful that they are more than deserving of our time and efforts by "having a heart for hospitalized veterans."

The Criteria for the Missouri Veterans Homes.

The Missouri Veterans Homes Program offers high-quality, compassionate care to Veterans who are in need of 24-hour long-term nursing care. Each of our Veterans Homes, are just that, the home of our nation's heroes. We pride ourselves on serving the Veterans by creating a community of care in a safe and dignified environment.

The 2025 monthly rate for residency is \$2,697. This rate is adjusted each year with an expected COLA increase each January.

To be eligible for admission into a Missouri Veterans Home an individual must:

- Meet criteria established by the VA for Veterans status
- Be a citizen of Missouri who has maintained a physical residency in Missouri for one hundred eighty (180) consecutive days immediately before application
- Physically living in the state of Missouri or proof of ownership of a residential home in the State of Missouri meets the eligibility requirements for the establishment of residency
- Not appear on any sex offender registry
- Not have a criminal history, including conviction or guilty plea/nolo contendere in any state (which, if committed in Missouri, would be) a Class A or B felony violation
- The Veteran must have documentation from a physician that he/she requires 24-hour skilled nursing care
- The Veteran's condition must be such that the Home has the resources to care for him/her



Eligibility and admission decisions are made by a team comprised of the Administrator, Physician, Director of Nursing, Social Worker, Veterans Service Officer, and other professionals as needed.



Reporting your hard work is essential for the organization to prosper.

I hope everyone had a terrific holiday. Thank you for your hard work and dedication; I am excited for what we can accomplish in the new year.

Now, let's get down to business! The business of our Veterans and all that they deserve.

First step: Open your Action Corps Weekly and "**PUSH THE BUTTON**". We are the voice for our heroes. Anyone can sign up; they do not have to be VFW or Auxiliary members.

Second step: Take action, tell congress Veterans deserve safer treatment. Ask your members of congress to support:

- H.R. 4837, WRITTEN INFORMED CONSENT ACT WOULD REQUIRE WRITTEN RISKS BEFORE VA PRESCRIBES CERTAIN PSYCHIATRIC MEDS.
- H.R. 2623, INNOVATIVE THERAPIES CENTERS OF EXCELLENCE ACT OF 2025 WOULD CREATE FIVE VA CENTERS FOR INNOVATIVE PTSD TREATMENTS. (WWW.gov/elected officials)
- H.R. 1845, TAP PROMOTION ACT, GUARANTEEING ALL TRANSITIONING SERVICE MEMBERS ACCESS TO VA ACCREDITED BENEFIT COUNSELORS.
- H.R. 3986, VETERANS CLAIMS QUALITY IMPROVEMENT ACT, IMPROVES TRAINING IN THE VA CLAIMS AND APPEALS SYSTEM.
- H.R. 2055/S,611, CARING FOR SURVIVORS ACT, INCREASES DIC FROM 43% TO 55% OF 100% DISABLED VETERAN'S BENEFIT.
- H.R. 1815, VA HOME LOAN PROGRAM REFORM ACT, RE-ESTABLISHES FORECLOSURE PREVENTION TOOLS THROUGH A PARTIAL CLAIM PROGRAM.

Third step: Go to the National Auxiliary website and utilize the tools that our National Ambassador has provided. Print off fliers and place in areas where Veterans or their family can see and also get involved. Not to mention place them at your Post, you'd be surprised how many Post and Auxiliary members aren't signed up for Action Corp Weekly.

The location of our Washington, D.C., office allows us to monitor all legislation affecting veterans, alert VFW membership to key legislation under consideration and to actively lobby Congress and the administration on veterans' issues. **National Legislative Service** establishes the VFW's legislative priorities and advocates on veterans' behalf. By testifying at congressional committee hearings and interacting with congressional members, the VFW has played an instrumental role in nearly every piece of veterans' legislation passed since the beginning of the 20th century. Everything we do on Capitol Hill is with the VFW's Priority Goals and veterans' well-being in mind. With the strength of the more than 1.4 million members of the VFW and its Auxiliary, our voice on Capitol Hill cannot be ignored!

Entry form is required and available in MALTA Member Resources. This required entry form must be to the Department Legislative Chairman by March 31, 2026 for judging.


New Members

National will send out \$250.00 to the departments that meet that goal. I know that we will meet that goal. As I am writing this, Department of Missouri is currently at 95.34%. I will keep everyone posted as to the progress of the membership. I am hoping that Department membership will be 97%+ by the end of January 2026. Always keep an application with you. You never know when you will meet a prospective member. You might meet one at a holiday party or even a community event. You might talk to a family member and find out they could possibly join.

With the new year starting, please remember to check everyone's ID cards as they attend an auxiliary meeting. You want to make sure that they are eligible to attend the meetings with a current ID card. If they haven't paid their dues as of December 31, 2025, they are not eligible to attend auxiliary meetings or vote. If an officer hasn't paid their current dues as of December 31, 2025, they are not able to hold their office. When a member pays their current dues, then they are able to attend the meetings and vote. So get those dues turned in.
