# "A single poppy has the soul of a thousand heroes and the tears of a million loved ones."

For over a hundred years the "Buddy"® Poppy has been an integral part of the VFW community. The Poppy is the official memorial flower of the VFW representing the blood shed by American service members. It reminds us that we will not forget their sacrifices.

This year marks 100 years since the VFW registered the name "Buddy" Poppy with the U.S. Patent Office. On May 20, 1924 a certificate was issued granting the VFW all trademark rights in the name Buddy under the classification of artificial flowers.

#### **How to Order**

- ✓ Is made of tin
- ✓ It does not REPLACE the original "Buddy"® Poppy but is an alternative to the original "Buddy"® Poppy.
- ✓ The original "Buddy"® Poppy is NOT going away.

#### "Buddy"® Poppy Distribution Tips

- 1. Contact your city/town clerk's office to see if a permit is required for your distribution event.
- 2. Get permission from your desired distribution location(s). Ask store manager/owners permission before promoting your distribution event.
- 3. Make sure Auxiliary members know when and where the distribution event will take place.
- 4. Contact your local radio station or paper to share information about your distribution event and/or share on social media.
- 5. Ask local youth groups for their assistance.
- 6. Have Poppy distributers wear Auxiliary (or VFW) braded clothing to promote the Auxiliary and VFW while also helping the public to connect the distribution event to the organization.
- 7. Use the "Buddy"® Poppy Chairmans Manuel to educate distributers. Remind them that they are distributing the Poppies for donations **NOT** selling them.

**NEVER** refuse someone a "Buddy"® Poppy because they are unable to donate.

### "Buddy"® Poppy Fall Contest

Our "Buddy"® Poppy Contest at the Fall Council of Administration this year will be a Christmas ornament contest.

- ✓ The theme for the ornaments will be Patriotic
- ✓ There will be two categories: Made by Youth (age 15 and below) and made by an Adult (age 16 and up).
- ✓ Ornament can be any size/shape. (Remember it must be able to hang on a tree.) ✓ Make sure you have at least one Poppy in its original form with tag on the ornament.
- ✓ An envelope with:
  - > Adult or Youth on outside >

On the inside:

- Auxiliary number
- number of members
- number of poppies used
- number of hours spent making ornament

#### DO NOT add anything to your ornament that will identify who made it.

Ornaments will be judged and winners will be announced during our meeting Saturday. Ornaments will be given to President Amy Jo Lett to distribute to Veterans Homes and Hospitals as she makes her visits.

- ✓ On a posterboard or trifold create a display explaining our "Buddy"® Poppy.

- ✓ An envelope with:
  - Nothing on the outside
  - > On the inside:
    - Auxiliary number
    - number of members
    - number of poppies used
    - number of hours spent making ornament
