The deadline for his contest is OCTOBER 31. This year's theme is: *How are you inspired by America?*

Voice of Democracy Audio-Essay Contest

This is also a VFW sponsored contest. Make sure that you are working closely with the VFW chairperson. Students must be a Missouri resident and in grades 9-12. The top national prize is \$30,000 and all department winners will enjoy an all-expense paid trip to Washington D.C. The deadline for this contest is OCTOBER 31. This year's theme is: *What are the greatest attributes of our Democracy?*

Remember to be reporting your events as they are completed. Don't wait to put your reports in the online reporting system.
